

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

You intentionally create and manage your online identity and understand that it can influence your sense of self, your personal life, and your professional life (Feerrar & Hammer, 2019; Mauthner & Kazimierczak, 2018).

You are aware that search engines, websites, platforms, and the Internet of Things (i.e., wearable technologies, smart homes, etc.), and some emails track your online activity and create your digital footprint. This can lead to privacy and surveillance concerns, especially for Indigenous Peoples (McMahon, 2020)



"....both a hidden curriculum of surveillance and intense pressure around employment futures, young people in particular then are being asked to navigate social media use (documenting their lives, hanging out with friends, and engaging in self-expression) with this threat of future reputational harm looming." *Robards and Graph 2022*




